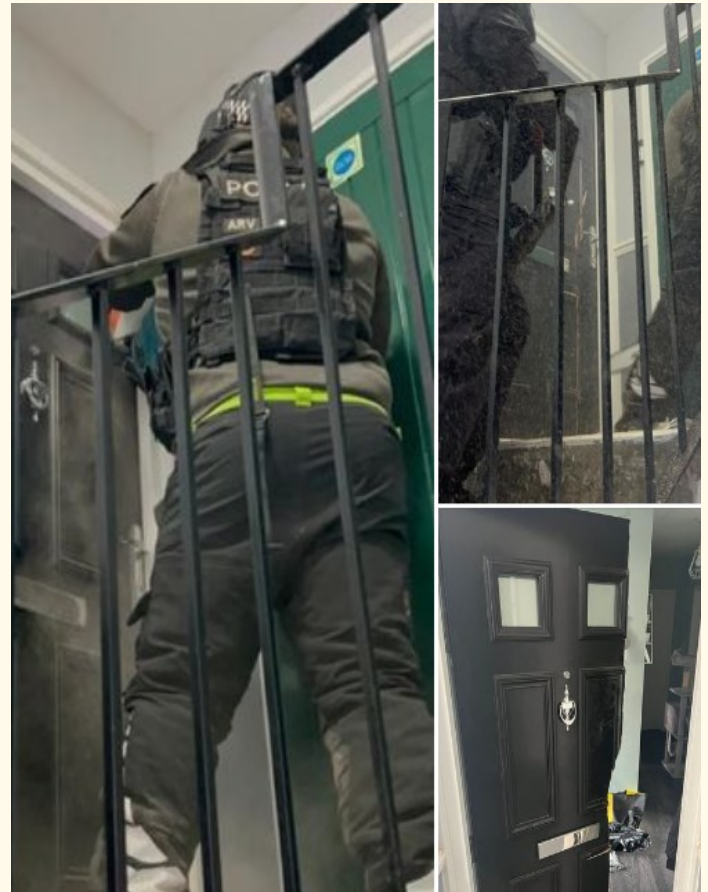
COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

In June, our Community Policing Team joined forces with our Op Falcon Team, Dog section and Approved Firearms Officers to carry out a warrant in Mercer Ave, Great Wakering.

Officers seized a quantity of substances believed to be drugs, together with cash. A man aged 38-years-old and a woman aged 36-years-old were arrested on suspicion of being concerned in the supply of drugs.

They have since been released on bail while enquiries continue.

We work tirelessly to reduce offences affecting our communities and information can be passed 100% anonymously to Crimestoppers on 0800 555 111.

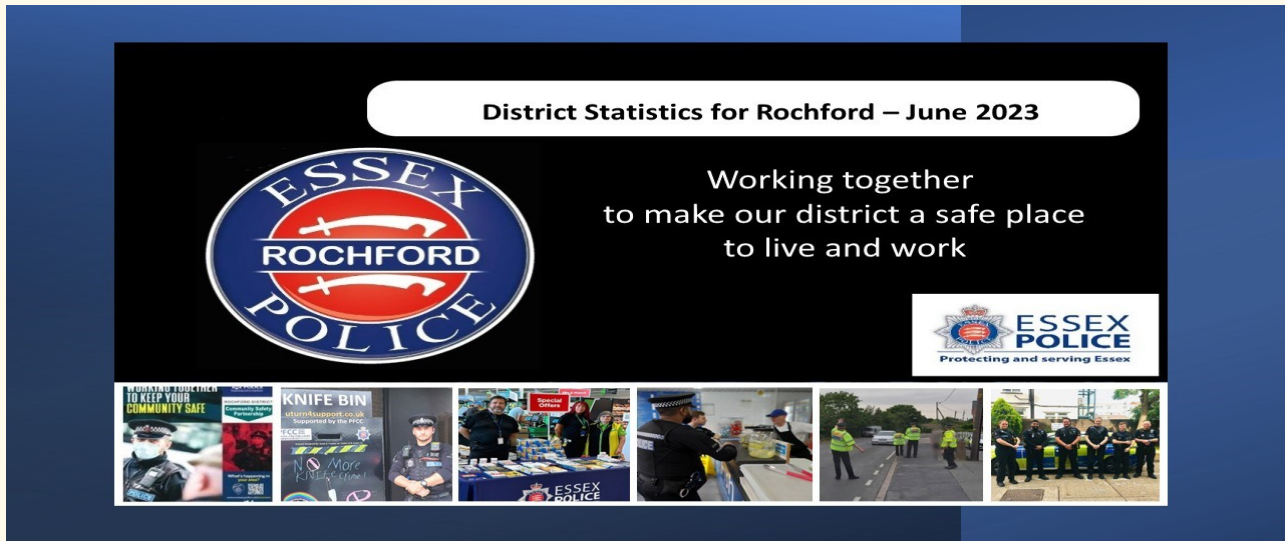

Reporting helps us to have a full understanding of what is happening and where, so we can tackle it with our partners at Rochford District Council.



DISTRICT STATISTICS



A snapshot of some of the things your Rochford Officers have dealt with during June:

We helped to find 25 people who were reported missing and helped them to get the support they needed.

We responded to 12 mental-health related incidents and worked with local partners to help those concerned get the help and support they needed.

We investigated 42 reports of antisocial behaviour having listened to local communities about the things which were causing them concern.

We attended 20 road traffic collisions, helping to keep those involved safe and our roads moving.

We investigated 103 reports of domestic violence incidents and made sure victims were given help, support, and advice, putting them in contact with relevant organisations where appropriate.

We solved 39 crimes, ensuring those intent on committing crime are held accountable for their actions.

We have submitted 181 pieces of intelligence which assists us in targeting criminal activity in our community.

Our officers also stopped and searched 48 people within our district to make sure they weren't carrying anything which could cause harm to themselves or someone else.

Criminals are experts at pretending to be someone they're not and can fool even the savviest of people.

If someone contacts you unprompted and asks for personal or financial information, stop and take a moment to think - even if they claim to be from an organisation you trust.

Remember it's ok to say no and contact the organisation through a route you know to be genuine.

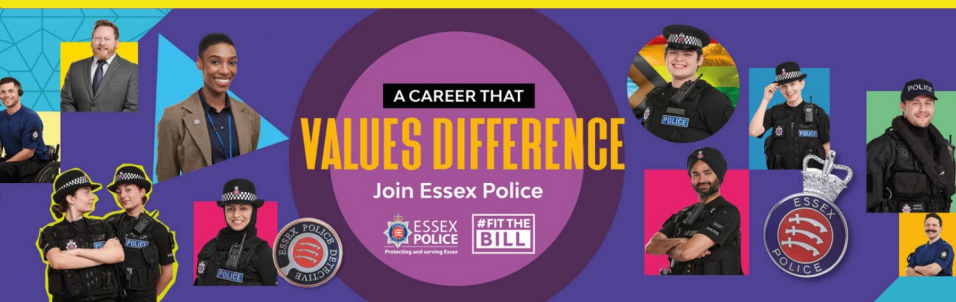
